# Start of Ramadan

In the beginning of Ramadan: Given that the start and end of Ramadan are determined by moon sightings, there may be variations in opinion among Muslims regarding its timing. Nationally recognized organizations such as the Fiqh Council of North America announce the beginning and end of Ramadan, as well as Eid ul Fitr. Ramadan, observed on the Islamic lunar calendar, involves abstaining from food, drink, and marital relations from dawn to sunset. This year, Ramadan is anticipated to commence around March 11, but exact dates may vary. It is advisable to consult local mosques or Muslim community leaders for precise timings. Eid ul-Fitr, the celebratory "feast of fast breaking" marking the end of Ramadan, is typically commemorated with prayers followed by multicultural bazaars and family activities, often attended by public officials.




